#### *About the Investigator and His Research in Forgiveness*

**Dr. Kenneth Pargament** is Professor of Clinical Psychology at Bowling Green State University and adjunct Professor of Psychology in the Counseling Psychology and Religion Ph.D. program at Boston University. He has published extensively on the vital role of religion in coping with stress and trauma. He is author of *The Psychology of Religion and Coping: Theory, Research, Practice* and co-editor of *Forgiveness: Theory, Research, Practice*. He is also a licensed Clinical Psychologist. His research is a collaborative effort with Mark S. Rye of University of Dayton. It looks at religious and non-religious interventions to help divorced women forgive.
